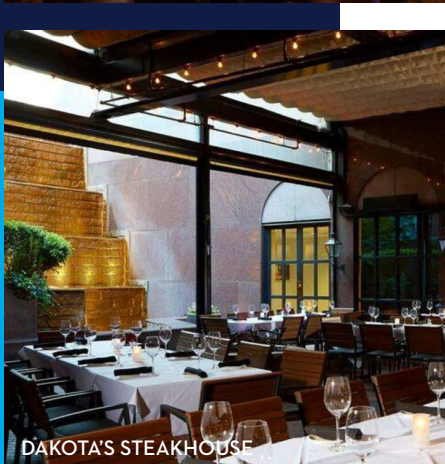

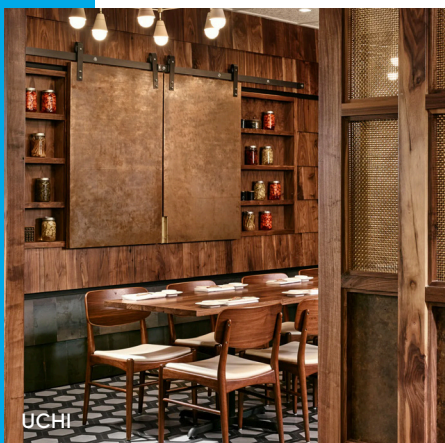

ARTS

■ DALLAS ARTS DISTRICT

The Dallas Arts District is the largest contiguous urban arts district in the nation, spanning 68 acres and 19 blocks. This walkable district is home to some of Dallas' most significant cultural landmarks, museums and performing arts venues, including the multi-venue AT&T Performing Arts Center, Dallas Museum of Art, Nasher Sculpture Center, Crow Museum of Asian Art, Meyerson Symphony Center and Moody Performance Hall. ■ DALLAS MUSEUM OF ART

Established in 1903, the Dallas Museum of Art (DMA) is a central figure in the vibrant Dallas Arts District. Don't miss a glimpse at precious jade ornaments from China, delicate Japanese scrolls and a rarely seen sandstone facade of an 18th century Indian residence.

The theater is located in the Dallas Arts District and home to the Dallas Theater Center, Dallas Black Dance Theatre and the Anita N. Martinez Ballet Folklorico.

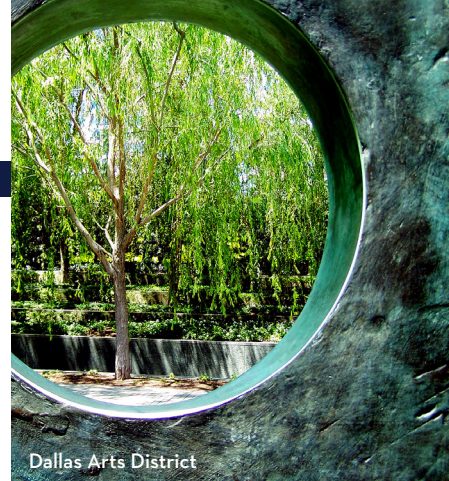

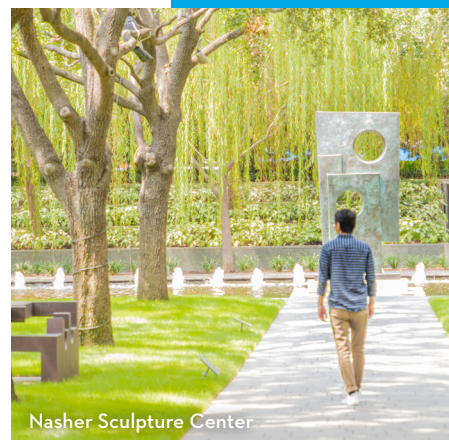

■ KLYDE WARREN PARK

Klyde Warren Park opened in 2012 and introduced a central green space in the middle of a bustling downtown. Built above a busy freeway, the 5.2-acre park delivers a comprehensive activities calendar, including daily fitness classes, a dog park, a children's center, games and live music. Food trucks and restaurants offer plenty of dining options.

■ THANKS-GIVING SQUARE

Designed in 1976 by architect Philip Johnson, this island of serenity in the heart of Downtown Dallas contains a landscaped meditation

garden with cascading fountains and a chapel open to people of all faiths and traditions. Gabriel Loire's dramatic Glory Window and Norman Rockwell's Golden Rule mosaic are highlights of the art collection on display.

■ PIONEER PLAZA

Located near the Kay Bailey Hutchison Convention Center Dallas, this is the largest bronze monument of its kind. It depicts a herd of larger-than-life steers and their cowboy escorts as they move along the Shawnee Trail during the 1850s.

ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICTS

■ TRINITY GROVES

This 15-acre foodie haven sits at the base of the Margaret Hunt Hill Bridge in West Dallas. With everything from barbecue to sushi and Italian to Tex-Mex, this unique destination has something for all tastes. The area is also home to the Restaurant Concept Incubator program, which encourages culinary entrepreneurs to develop restaurant concepts to become the newest additions on the block.
